## Word Chaining

Focus Area: Phonics

Timing: 5-10 minutes

## Materials:

List(s) of words with one sound change

## **Procedure:**

OR

- Say the first word in the chain and have students repeat the word. Then, have them spell the word with letter cards or tiles.
- Next, tell them they have to change one sound to make a new word, and give them the new word. After they spell it, have them read the new word.

"Say 'dog'. Now spell dog."	d-o-g
"Change <i>dog</i> to <i>hog</i> ."	h-o-g
"Change <i>hog</i> to <i>hop</i> ."	h-o-p
"Change <i>hop</i> to <i>hip</i> ."	h-i-p
"Change <i>hip</i> to <i>hi</i> s."	h-i-s
"Say 'dog'. Now spell dog."	d-o-g
"Instead of /d/, say /p/."	h-o-g

"Instead of /g/, say /p/."	h-o-p

"Instead of /o/, say /i/."	h-i-p

	"Change dog to hog."  "Change hog to hop."  "Change hop to hip."  "Change hip to his."  "Say 'dog'. Now spell dog."  "Instead of /d/, say /p/."  • What's the word?  "Instead of /g/, say /p/."  • What's the word?  "Instead of /o/, say /i/."

o "Instead of /h/, say /s/."

It's important NOT to tell students which letter to change; they need to hear it!

h-i-s

- Begin by changing initial sounds, then final sounds, then medial sounds.
- To make it more difficult, you can use blends and add or leave out sounds (e.g., change snack to sack; change clash to slash)
- Once students can do this, you can mix up the changes.
